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PROLOGUE: HISTORICAL DEVELOPMENT

- 1976 Foundation and institutional establishment of the psychodrama department at the ÖAGG
- 1978 Creation of the first training regulations
- 1991 Decree of The Austrian Psychotherapy Act. -> Psychodrama in Austria is classified as one typ of humanistic therapies
- 1993 Recognition of the psychodrama department as a training institution for psychodrama psychotherapy through the Austrian Federal Ministry of Health
- 1995 Set up of the first psychotherapy training group according to the new curriculum
- 2005 Start of cooperation between psychodrama department and Danube University
- -> Specialised training courses for psychodrama psychotherapists with a university degrees in psychodrama psychotherapy
- -> Additionally "Upgrade"- courses
- 2019: current status: 2005-2019

24 Starts of specialised training courses in psychodrama-psychotherapy and 7 upgrading courses!

200 Students currently studying!

139 approved master theses in psychodrama psychotherapy!

DEFINITION AND REQUIREMENTS: A PSYCHODRAMA MASTER THESIS ...

- is a scientific text which contains 18.000 30.000 words, which is about 80 130 A4 pages.
- requires considering scientific principles and applying scientific methods of psychotherapy research.
- must be based on theoretical or practice-orientated topics in the field of psychodrama psychotherapy.
- · requires the combination of psychodrama therapeutic practice with psychodrama theoretical concepts.
- must be theoretically based on Moreno's role theory or current developments in humanistic psychodrama.
- · can be written individually or as a couple.

2.2. MASTER THESES WITH QUANTITATIVE RESEARCH DESIGNS: 4

- Quantitative evaluation studies: 3 master theses evaluated a psychodrama group therapy using quantifying examination methods (tests, self-evaluation scales) in a pre-post design:
- Grauf: inpatient group therapy for structural disorders
- Trinkel: outpatient therapy group for structural disorders
- Schabata: psychodrama follow-up group for breast cancer
- · Quantitative comparative study: I master thesis
- Hupmann: the experience of the technique of sharing in 2 different psychodrama groups

- Hölzl & Klausegger: the work with the real social atom in therapeutic outreach family work.
- Beer: psychodrama-specific therapeutic attitude of Austrian psychotherapy trainers.
- Ortner: possibilities of psychodrama therapy in dissociative personality disorder.
- Heider: appearance and processing of shame in psychodrama therapy
- Helbich: gender sensitivity of psychodrama psychotherapist trainers
- Fink: importance of Moreno's therapeutic philosophy for contemporary psychodramatists
- Licka-Beinhofer: psychodrama group therapy in an inpatient context through expert interviews with therapists.
- Gutmann: the role of Auxiliary Ego in the psychodrama group with children (group discussion of children and auxiliary egos)

Most of these researchers used the content analysis of Mayring, Ortner used the typological analysis.

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AD 2.3. MASTER THESES WITH QUALITATIVE RESEARCH DESIGNS: CONTINUATION FIELD RESEARCH

· Field research: 6 master theses

Following authors used other (than interviews) or additional research methods to investigate their field of psychodrama therapy:

- Kühbauer: possibilities of the somatic part of the warm-up phase in mandatory anti-violence training for young men in a forced context- observation, group discussion & expert interview
- Kastner: the appropriate therapeutic support for women with complex or childhood trauma (with dissociative identity disorder) Grounded Theory
- Jelinek: encounter group of Slovenian and "German" Carinthians recorded conversation contributions & content analysis
- Pek: use of "lifeline" in group work with male Arab refugees participant observation, interpreted by scenic understanding
- Goger: the possibilities of direction in offering choices (for the protagonist) in psychodrama in inpatient groups observations & theoretical interpretation
- Neureiter-Penn: group cohesion in the group psychodrama therapy of traumatized patients in an inpatient context a questionnaire (Stuttgarter Bogen) & content analysis.

- Ressl: an individual psychodrama therapy in burnout therapy report of the patient & content analysis (Mayring)

- Qualitative comparative study: I master thesis

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2.4. MASTER THESES WITH MIXED-METHOD RESEARCH DESIGNS: 8

- Sageder: the role of fathers in treating male patients in Morenos reports quantitative and qualitative evaluation of Moreno case reports by means of a content analysis.

The field studies by *Lechner* and *Grissenberger* investigate the respective field with the help of quantitative and qualitative survey methods:

- Lechner: involvement of parents in the therapy process of their children asking the parents by questionnaires & quantitative + qualitative evaluation
- Grissenberger: the effects of forming social relationships in alcohol therapy -social atoms (produced at 4 different points) & quantitative and qualitative Comparation

2.4. MASTER THESES WITH MIXED-METHOD RESEARCH DESIGNS: CONTINUATION

- · Evaluation studies with mixed method research designs: 5 thesis
- Zauner: individual psychodrama therapy with one male depressed adolescent psychometric data from clinicalpsychological diagnostics (quantitative) and observation protocols, visual therapy material and an expert interview (qualitative)
- Kühtreiber: the role development of children in a children's group quantitative observation data & interview protocols
- Pfohl: a social competence group of adolescent Asperger patients FEEL test (quantitative) & semi-structured interviews (participants) & observations (group)
- Starzer-Eidenberger: psychodrama in a group for quitting smoking various quantitative data collection tools and qualitative data on the therapy process (HAT, therapy diary).
- Heger: the use of movies in psychodrama group therapy problem-specific questionnaires and scales on social competence and self-efficacy (pre and post).
